



Weekly Server MOH Covenant & Commitments

Weekly Server MOH -

1. I will serve each day during the month I am scheduled for the specific service or services. If I can't be at church for any reason as scheduled, I will be sure to have either spoken to a substitute server (using the "buddy system") to take my place or spoken to the Service Leader and/or Ministry Leader with as much advance notice as possible.
2. I will protect the unity of my church by acting in love toward other members by refusing to gossip and by following the leaders. If there is a disagreement, I will determine if it is with a process or with a person. If it is a process, I will first speak to the person responsible for it. If it is a person, I will first speak directly to the person about it.
3. I will serve the ministry of my church by discovering my gifts and talents and by developing a servant's heart. I support the church's vision to create raving fans in all ministries.
4. I will share the responsibility of my church by praying for its growth, by inviting the unchurched to attend and by warmly welcoming those who visit.
5. I will support the testimony of my church by attending one service faithfully, by serving cheerfully, living a godly life, and giving regularly.
6. I will pray about becoming a Service Leader. I will assist the Service Leader in helping First Time Servers and helping to reach new Monthly and Weekly Servers.
7. I will sign the weekly server covenant.

Dress Code-

As a server for Christ, you may ask the question "What should I wear?" The simple answer is "Be yourself and keep your style." To ensure a great worship experience for everyone at Stonepoint, follow the following guidelines for "what not to wear".

All:

Short sleeves are cool. Shorts are not.
Pull up your pants, make sure all clothes cover your upper and middle body.
No flip flops or sandals

Women:

If you wear sleeveless blouses or dresses, use the 3-finger rule.
Skirts should be approximately knee length and not too tight or see-through

Concept Regarding Dress Code:

The dress code is important. If you arrive for service and your Team Leader or Pastor feels that your clothing is inappropriate, you may be asked to go home and change. The dress code is not intended to cramp your style or dictate what you should wear. However, when we serve, a different set of guidelines applies. If you have a question about the way you are dressed, then you should probably re-think your outfit. Check in the mirror before you leave home. Don't wear anything with the intention of drawing attention to yourself. It's not about us!
